You choose a health plan for your child from the ones available in your service area. Benefits include regular checkups, vaccines, hospital care, x-rays and lab tests, treatment of special health needs and pre-existing conditions, and healthcare in the following areas: mental, medical: including visits with doctors and specialists, dental, hearing, and vision. There is also CHIP Perinatal which is coverage for unborn children.

The OCA takes complaints from the public including foster youth ages 18 years old and older, and former foster youth. The OCA can address general, non-specific inquiries and questions about a DFPS case as well as the case process. The OCA conducts formal reviews of a Child Protective investigation when the investigation concludes a person abused or neglected a child. This is handled through the OCA review process (formerly called the OCR review process). We also refer people to other agencies and programs that may be able to assist them.

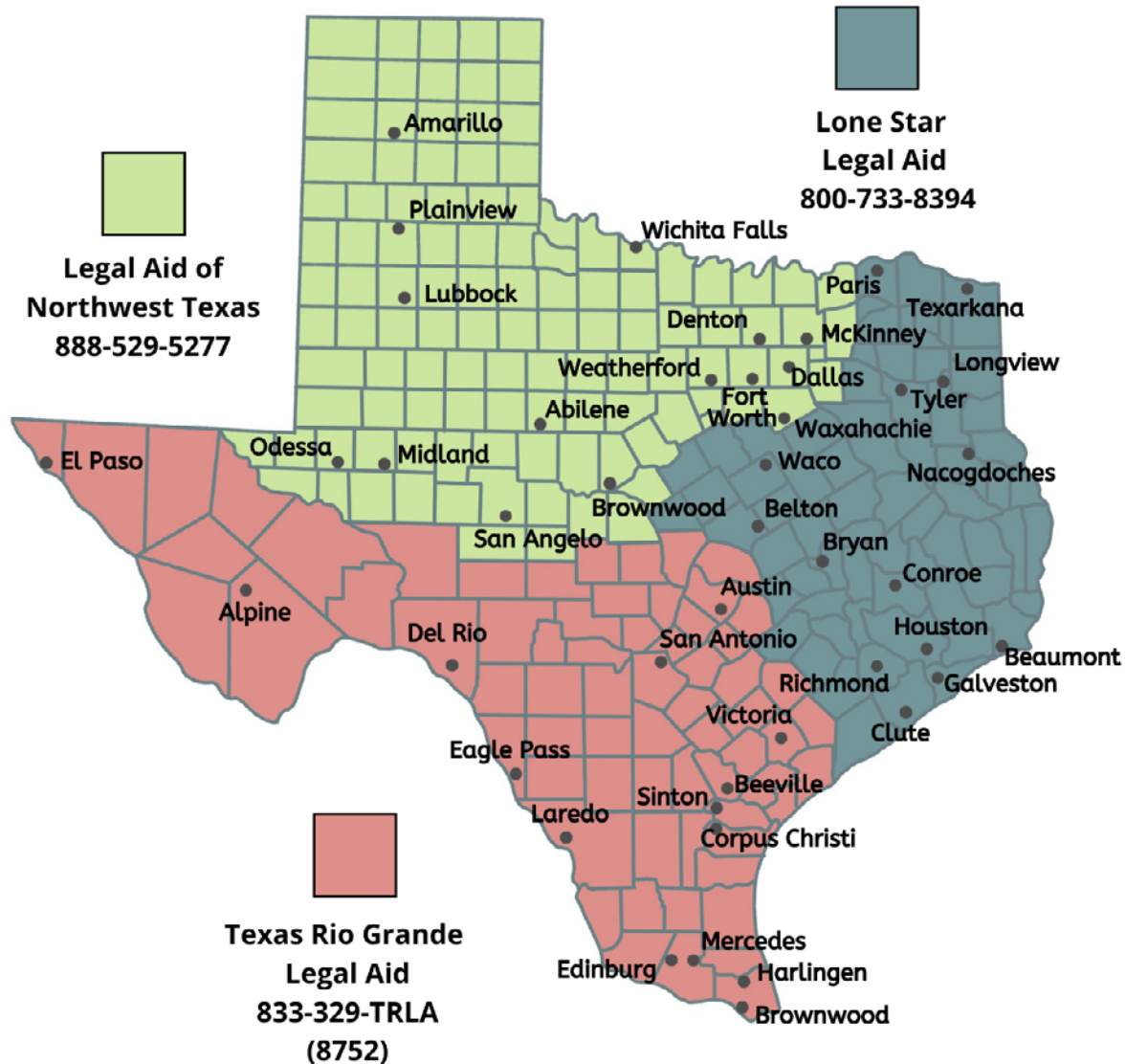

LEGAL AID PROGRAMS

Introduction to Civil Legal Aid

The federal government, through the Legal Services Corporation (LSC), funds three legal services programs that serve every county in Texas: Legal Aid of NorthWest Texas, Lone Star Legal Aid and Texas RioGrande Legal Aid. The three LSC funded programs provide a wide range of civil legal services. Over 40% of the cases handled are family law cases. Most other cases are in the areas of housing, consumer law, employment, public benefits, or issues affecting the elderly. Due to federal restrictions, these LSC funded programs cannot handle criminal cases or immigration cases, except for representation of immigrants who have been victims of violent crime.



Funding for legal services programs is extremely limited. Legal aid programs must turn away many with serious legal needs due to limited resources. LSC funded programs, and most other programs included in this directory, must refuse service to any applicant whose income is above specific federal poverty guidelines.

In most situations, the family income must fall below 125% of the federal poverty income guidelines. But in some situations, the family income can be up to 200% of the poverty guidelines. So even if your household exceeds the 125% guidelines, you should still apply.

After the initial half-hour consultation, should the caller decide to authorize the lawyer to take action on their legal issue, the caller and lawyer may negotiate fees. These fees may be on a full or reduced fee basis, depending on the program the attorney is participating in.

Sliding Scale Fees: A reduced fee arrangement based on a review of the client's overall income and ability to pay.
